The BSN degree is a completion degree which requires students who enter the program to have an associate's degree in nursing and an RN licensure prior. The courses below are the specific courses UHD that eligible students must take to complete the BSN. In addition, if students who join the program have not completed their common core requirements, they will need to complete those courses as part of the BSN degree.

For students who have been accepted to the BSN; must have completed an associate's degree in nursing and RN licensure. These courses will likely be taken as final year completion courses.
