

Writing Course Learning Outcomes

Course Learning Outcomes (CLOs) are statements that describe observable, measurable learning and behaviors that students will achieve upon completion of a course. Outcomes are written with a verb phrase and declare a demonstrable action within a given timeframe, such as the completion of a course. It is typical to find five to nine CLOs for a course, though this can vary depending on program needs.
